BURN PERMITS

Careless debris and agricultural burning is a major cause of wildfires every year in Utah. Most people never intend to start a wildfire, but unsafe burning practices can produce disastrous results. Anyone wishing to open burn must first obtain a permit from the Mt. Pleasant City Fire Department. Please call 435-462-2456 to obtain a fire permit. Permits will be issued on Thursday's. Fines will be imposed if you are caught burning without a permit. Firepits and camp fires need a permit.



Mount Pleasant City sends out letters every month if we see a spike in your water usage. Please take these letters seriously and check for leaks. Not only are water leaks costly but it is wasting our culinary water. Some tips to check for leaks. 1) Look at your usage, If a family of four is using more than 12,000 gallons of water during the winter months there's a serious leak. 2) Watch your bill, generally your water bill should remain around the same from month to month. 3) Toilets can account for up to 30 percent of your water usage so check and make sure they are running properly. 4) Check your exterior faucets. 5) Watch for unexpected water, if you smell mold or foul smells it may also indicate you have a leak.

Why Your Sewer May Increase On Your Next Bill...

Mount Pleasant City has a set amount of a \$17 dollar base fee on any and all sewer accounts. On top of this base fee an average water usage over 3000 gallons is added to that base fee. Your average is calculated by taking your water usage from October through March. You will see these changes on your April billing. The following resolution is followed:

MT. PLEASANT CITY RESOLUTION 2017-09

A RESOLUTION SETTING SEWER RATES

WHEREAS, Mt. Pleasant City adopted Resolution 2012-9 on May 22, 2012, said resolution pertaining to the adoption of sewer fees; and

WHEREAS, rising costs for service and maintenance exceed the City's capacity to maintain the sewer system under the current fee schedule; and

WHEREAS, the public health of its citizens is a primary policy issue for the governing body of the City and a well- functioning sewer system is a mandate that must be met. **NOW, THEREFORE** be it resolved that Resolution 2012-9 is hereby rescinded and the following sewer fee schedule is hereby adopted.

The Mt. Pleasant sewer rates are hereby amended as follows:

\$17.00 for the first 3,000 gallons; and

\$1.75 per thousand gallons thereafter.

The rates will become effective for the July 1, 2017 billing.

An annual review will be made every April to accommodate any deficiency.
