CULINARY WATER RATE INCREASE

You may notice an increase in your culinary water bill this month. Water increases were made effective June 1, 2019. A resolution was passed on April 9th, 2019 to increase the water to the following:

Within City Limits

- \$24.00 Minimum for first 3,000 gal
- \$1.50 per 1,000 gal used from 3,001 to 10,000
- \$2.50 per 1000 gal used from 10,001 to 20,000
- \$2.75 per 1000 gal used from 20,001 to 40,000
- \$3.00 per 1000 gal used from 40,001 to 50,000
- \$3.25 per 1000 gal used above 50,001

Outside City Limits

- \$36.00 for first 3,000 gal
- \$1.50 per 1,000 gal used from 3,001 to 10,000
- \$2.50 per 1000 gal used from 10,001 to 20,000
- \$2.75 per 1000 gal used from 20,001 to 40,000
- \$3.00 per 1000 gal used from 40,001 to 50,000
- \$3.25 per 1000 gal used above 50,001

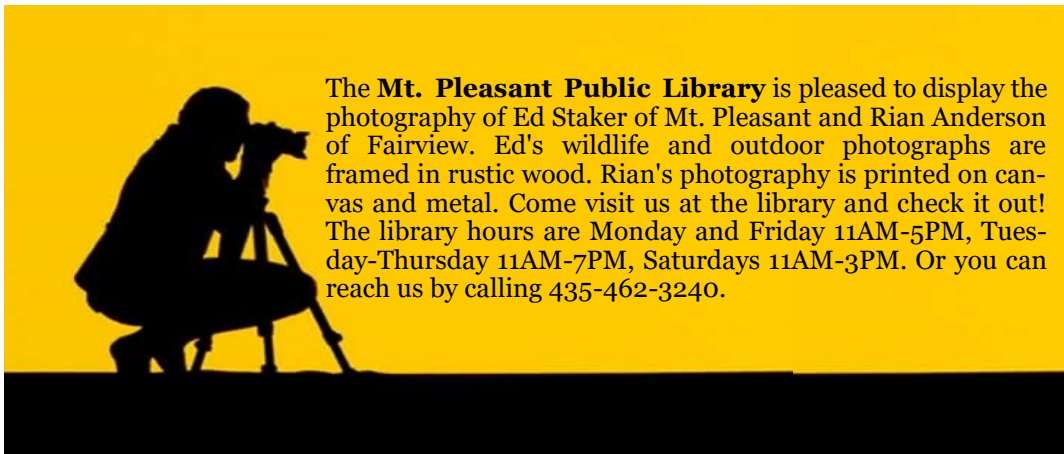
